It was fantastic to see that 80% of students had completed 100% homework. However, it is still a challenge for students, who need to be more organised and focussed, and we want parents to encourage their child to take homework seriously and ensure it is completed to the best of their ability.

A parents' website named 'e-Skool, states some very clear reasons why homework is important.

Here are the top 14 reasons why Homework is important:

1. It improves your child's thinking and memory
2. It helps your child develop positive study skills and habits that will serve him or her well throughout life
3. Homework encourages your child to use time wisely
4. It teaches your child to work independently
5. Homework teaches your child to take responsibility for his or her work
6. It allows your child to review and practice what has been covered in class
7. It helps your child to get ready for the next day's class
8. Homework helps your child learn to use resources, such as libraries, reference materials, and computer Web sites to find information
9. It encourages your child to explore subjects more fully than classroom time permits
10. It allows your child to extend learning by applying skills to new situations

You may have noticed that we have been busy designing a new website. We have listened to what parents, visitors and staff have told us and have made vast improvements to the appearance, user journey and content of the website.

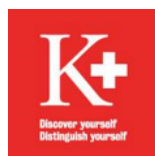

Widening Participation- **K+ PROGRAMME FOR YEAR 12 PUPILS**



On Wednesday 4th October, 9.30-10.30am, Shafaq Adnan, a final year medical student at King's will be delivering a K+ Talk to prospective K+ Year 12 in Room D189 (See Mr Browne).

K+ is a free programme which equips post-16 students, from under-represented groups, with the knowledge, confidence and skills to transition successfully to university.

Have you got at least English and Maths at 4 or above and 6 A-C grades at GCSE or equivalent with a minimum of 5 A or A* grades and / or 7's or above?*

As part of this two-year scheme, K+ students will:

- Receive a student e-mentor
- Take part in academic, cultural and careers-related experiences
- Attend our summer school and complete an academic assignment
- Receive support and guidance in applying to university
- Receive special consideration when applying to King's College London

Over the past couple years we have had several cohorts of students on the K+ programme, very recent cohorts of 2017 are Haleen Kurana & Zumra Khan with Thomas Bridgeman (13CAA) cohort of 2018.
