

Alumnus of the Week – Mr French

Simone Aubrey 1973 to 1980

After leaving Southfields in 1980 I took up a training post in St.Thomas' Hospital, London, as a medical laboratory technician. Whilst rotating through different departments in the medical school and hospital I gained a keen desire to have direct patient contact rather than deal with fluid and tissue samples or imaging.

I took up a permanent post in the respiratory function lab and worked my way up the ranks from junior to senior physiological measurement technologist, gaining an HNC in the subject along the way. I was then asked to set up the Sleep laboratory in 1988, one of only 5 in existence in the UK at that time.

I took advantage of working mainly nights to do a full time degree in Biomedical Science at Kingston University during the day. In 1993 I graduated with first class honours. From working alone at night monitoring one or two patients at a time we went on to expand to a 9 bed, purpose built unit with more than 30 technologists working and training under me, in both sleep and respiratory physiology.

I enjoyed having my own clinical caseload and also being involved in setting the training and education standards, not only for our hospital but also across the whole of the UK and then Europe. My pinnacle was when I became the president if the European Society of Sleep Technologists, writing the exams for the technologists and also setting the questions on the diagnostics of sleep disorders for the physicians and scientists. To date, around 200 technologists and 1000 physicians and scientists across Europe and beyond have attained this masters level certificate in Sleep Medicine.

I left Guys and St. Thomas hospitals back in 2010 to come and live in Spain with my husband and various rescue animals. We have a wonderful life here, I still keep my hand in the world of sleep, scoring and analysing sleep records for several different hospitals in the UK. I even had my own training school and sleep lab here until very recently.

My passion now though, now that I'm very nearly retired, is playing darts- a talent I discovered I had when we moved out here 7 years ago. I am still in contact with several of my class and schoolmates from the Southfields days (73-80) and some come out and visit for the odd glass of wine and 320 days of sunshine per year.

Thank you Southfields for giving be the background, education and values that have brought me to where I am now.
