Mathis Badal said "This has been a very good opportunity for us to be able to choose books that we want in our library. The party was very exciting and we had a lot of fun"










#### The Million Word Reader Club


**Jessie Samboer** – Year 7 (7HBG) for always producing excellent written work that is often used as a model answer for the class?
