Students learnt about the new tunnel being bored under London which will take over our old and inadequate sewage system and in addition worked on sustainable urban drainage systems (SUDS).

We can all take ownership in our own little way to make sure the River Thames does not flood in the future. Buying a water harvesting tank from your local DIY store, planting a few more plants on your property are just two examples.
