On Tuesday 10th July over 200 Year 6 students attended their induction day at Southfields Academy. The day began with an assembly encompassing welcomes and introductions from their new Head of Year, Mrs Douglas along with their new Tutor teams.

The students were then introduced to their tutor bases where they completed a series of small group and whole class tasks in order to get to know their tutors and fellow tutees better. All students completed an English baseline test followed by taking part in a series of different activities, including a tour of the Academy, taster lessons in PE, drama, art, and science, Spanish or DT.
