

#### **Spotlight Dance Show - Ms Risolino**





On Monday 10<sup>th</sup> December the Southfields Academy winter dance show, *Spotlight*, took place to a sold out audience of 130 people. Thank you so much to everyone who came - the audience was fantastic and so supportive of the talented and brave performers.

The show was a collection of work from students in every year, from a Year 7 soloist, Indiana, to performances from dancers in Year 13. All styles were celebrated and acts came in all shapes and sizes.

There was an exciting number by 5 Year 8 boys who created an original piece based on current social grooves; a dramatic dance by Year 12 dancers Deanna and Karl who performed two stunning duets as well as solos and duets from the most dedicated year 8 girls, Valentina, Caprice and Maria.

The Year 13 dancers, Shayanne, Luke, Daniella and Patricia, performed a contemporary piece based on the work of contemporary dance legend Alvin Ailey in an energetic and technically complex piece. They showed their versatility with a contrasting waacking number joined by Karl in Year 12 who performed in a total of 4 dances. The Year 13 dancers completed a trio of performances with a lyrical contemporary dance depicting the bittersweet end and a nostalgic nod to mark their journey at Southfields Academy with the use of their own directed film to complement their live dance edited by Daniella.

Year 10 and 11 BTEC dancers collaborated with each other to perform a piece of hip hop theatre as part of their mock assessment. The dancers had to communicate a clear message to a teenage target audience raising awareness about the consequences of gang culture. The dancers used a combination of ensemble moments, group sections and duets that created a full scale and dramatic production. This will also act as the dancers' competition entry for this year's London Youth Games, we wish them good luck!

A huge congratulations to the other superb performers who choreographed their own dances: Laysa, Eugenia, Gemima, Henry, Aiesha, Shannaigh and not forgetting the debut performance from the Year 9 new BTEC dancers who ended the unforgettable show in a celebration of the dances they have been studying this term.
