


Southfields Window Wanderland – Ms Breen

Science Club - Coloured Fire Gel

Mosaic Mentoring – Maria Fearon



On Monday 4th February Mosaic Mentoring, World of Work, paid a visit to the City of London, Wood Street Police Station. This was a very positive experience to culminate seven weeks of mentoring the Year 10 and IG students. Despite the grey day, the trek into the City of London was filled with curiosity and excitement, as it was the group's first visit to a police station. On arrival, each member of the group was issued with a red lanyard ID pass, emphasising the importance of security in the building.

The day was an eye-opener; it was very informative, filled with energising activities, more than just a normal school day in the classroom. The group had the opportunity to see a variety of professionals on the job, from an experienced Special Constable who had over 15 years' service to young apprentices in different roles in the organisation. A fierce barking German shepherd and a tail wagging and sniffing English springer spaniel were the K9s who demonstrated their invaluable role. The dog handlers described the dogs as an important crime fighting tool to protect and maintain public safety. The next session involved the Public Order/Riot Police; a few brave students dressed in protective helmet and gloves, and armed with a battering ram were encouraged to break down a door, by the team. It demanded strong muscles to carry through the instructions of the Police Officer. After many attempts, Gordon (one of the mentors) successfully barged in.

Throughout the visit the students demonstrated good communication skills and confidence. They managed their feelings well (even when afraid of the dogs) and were attentive throughout the presentation given by the apprentices. We are grateful to the City of London Police for accommodating our Mosaic Mentoring group. Ms Gavin (DHOY) was delighted the Year 10 students were such good ambassadors.

Girl's in Maths' Day - Ms Ahmad





On Thursday 7th February, nine Year 8 students participated in the very first 'Girl's in Maths' Day at St John Bosco College.
