During the May half-term, Mr Reis had the pleasure to host the last of a series of art masterclasses that have been taking place at Southfields Academy this year. Laura Benetton, whose artwork has recently been auctioned at Christies, was invited to deliver this session. After meeting her during a visit to her studio earlier this year, a group of students had the opportunity to produce artwork under her guidance. The artist produces abstract paintings inspired by the colours and movement of both birds and butterfly wings. She uses a mix of different media ranging from acrylic paint, ink, oil pastels to spray paint. She applies the paint to her canvas using a range of spatulas and palette knives and layers them mimicking the movements of birds and butterflies flying. Laura Benetton has just arrived back from China, where she completed an artistic residency as the Italian art ambassador. The day consisted of a series of activities exploring her ideas and techniques. In the morning the students created a series of experimental work exploring some of her techniques and materials and in the afternoon they were coached in applying those techniques while developing personal work. It was a very special day that ended with the most amazing artwork being produced. #### Nike: On Air presents The London Department

This Spring, Nike: On Air returns to London for a day of creative sessions inspired by the Air Max design journey.

On March 30, Nike Sportswear will come together with design association 'Store Projects' to host The London Department, which will see two workshops take place in Coal Drops Yard. One focusing on Industrial Design and another on Colour & Materials. Store Projects is a London-based association of artists, architects and designers, who have a community first approach and focus on driving and facilitating change in the urban environment.

Store Projects will be working exclusively with local schools in Camden and the surrounding boroughs to give those engaged and excited by design the opportunity to attend The London Department. Although the attendees will follow the same process Nike Designers go through to create Air Max, they will in fact be designing and building their own physical product inspired by the city that surrounds them and utilising truly innovative techniques and materials. For Industrial Design this will be an air inspired chair and for Colour & Material a pair of experimental laces.

Each session will open with an inspirational talk from Nereida Pedroza, Senior Director of Colour and Materials at Nike, giving unimaginable access to one of the creative minds behind Air Max. Store Projects will then take participants through the learning and doing elements of the workshop – introducing them to the methods and materials they will use, before guiding them through the build process that will lead to the development of their final product.
