## Art Workshops – Mr Reis



With the academic year coming to an end there are lots of opportunities for activities and workshops in the many subjects areas. Last Wednesday Mr Reis ran an all-day workshop with the Year 10 GCSE students.

Students in this group were able to take full advantage of the modern facilities to create a sustained piece of art as a result of the research and investigations they have done through the year. The ideas revolve around the topic of '*Identity*'. Students were challenged to show two contrasting aspects of their identity through the use of visual language and a range of materials and techniques.



On Monday, a similar activity took place. The aim of this workshop was to develop awareness of the Holocaust through analysing art created during this period. Students analysed drawings and paintings looking at the sad and cold colours used in depicting burning cities, imprisonment, war and death. This was followed by a practical activity where students created visual responses to their findings. The work created was outstanding. The students chose to use street art influences (stencilling, spray paint and graffiti references) which supported in creating these very personalized and informed outcomes.
