This Week in PE

Year 11 continued their invasion unit, this time participating in Ultimate Frisbee. They then practiced throwing and catching the Frisbee, before moving into drills to replicate a game situation. Students then participated in a game to put those skills into action.

Meanwhile Mr Munro's Year 8 class completed their gymnastic routines this week in PE. They created a routine that contained all of the skills they had learned over the previous five weeks, such as counter balance, counter tension, unison and canon. Students then performed it in front of the whole class at the end of the lesson. They then gave feedback to each other and the lesson ended with a well-deserved round of applause for all pairs.
