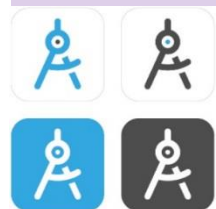




Good News from Mathematics – Mr Duffy

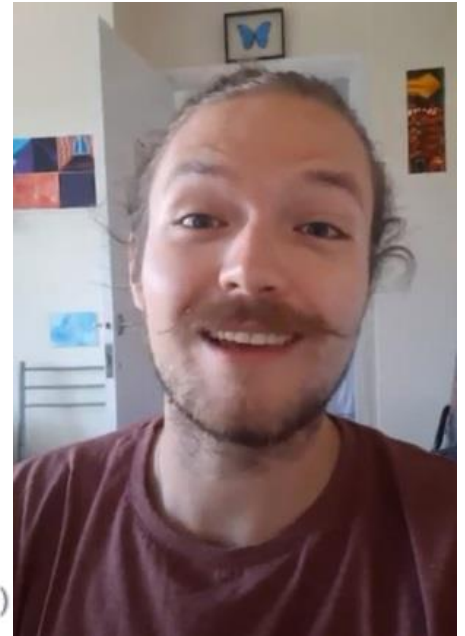

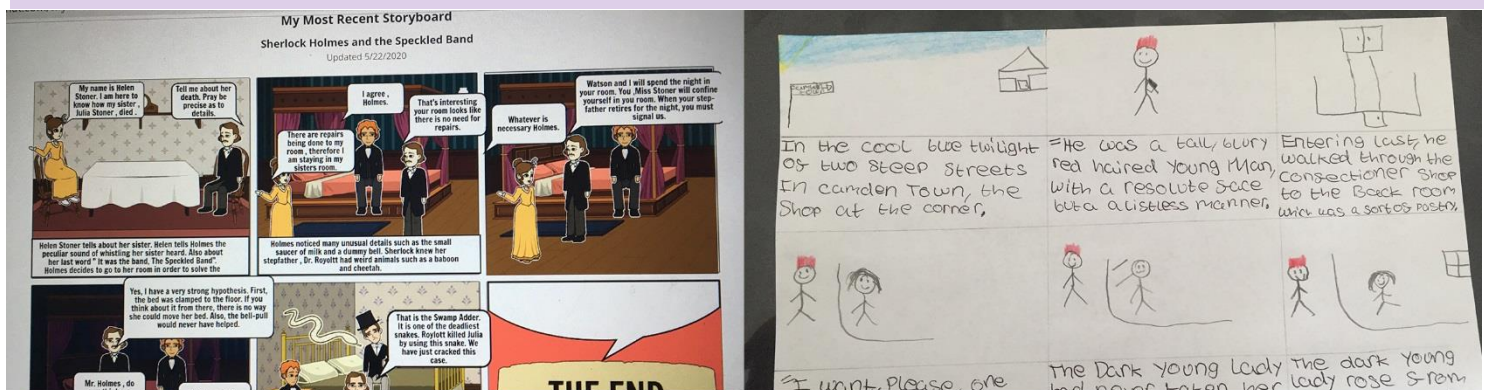
