Sandra Chevrier is a Canadian contemporary artist. She produces artwork the exposes the limitations of our world. She creates masks using comic strips as an attempt to empower people with superhero powers.

Students' Online Safety

Communication and Relationships:


 What parents can do when teenagers won't listen and how to manage your own feelings during parent-child disputes
