Laptops and Wi-Fi scheme – support needed

The Power to Connect Tech4Good award winning campaign helps local families access schoolwork from home with refurbished computers or broadband vouchers. Since launch, hundreds of emergency phone data top-up vouchers and Wi-Fi dongles, funded by a £10,000 donation from the Battersea Power Station Foundation, have been distributed to families in the borough.

Nearly 400 donated laptops, tablets and desktop computers have been refurbished into Google Chromebooks, by IT volunteers and distributed to 46 Wandsworth schools and 6 Community Organisations. With many students across the borough self-isolating due to Covid-19, Power to Connect is still in need of devices to reach demand.

In PE This Week – Mr Munro



Year 7 continued with their netball unit of work this week. Their focus within netball was bounce passes. Students participated within small-sided games, where all passes were required to be bounce passes. They used their tactical awareness to create space so a bounce pass could be played.



Year 11 ran their own basketball tournament in PE this week. Four students organised teams, fixtures, officials and rules to hold a four-team round robin tournament. Games were very close and competitive throughout, with the winning team being victorious by just one point.

Year 9 continued their rugby topic this week, focussing on offside and playing the ball. Students had to combine skill and tactics to make this lesson successful. Playing the ball once tagged and with the opposition ensuring they weren't offside before making an attempt to regain possession.

They were fantastic throughout the lesson, showing excellent practical ability and tactical awareness.



Year 9 completed their handball assessment this week. Students were assessed in all of the skills that have been learned throughout the topic so far. They needed to display excellent physical ability, such as dribbling, passing and shooting skills, as well as their social, thinking and personal skills.

All students performed excellently well within the lesson, and there were some fantastic grades awarded based on their performances
