EU Settlement Scheme



If you or someone in your family is an EU National, you have until June 30 to apply for settled or pre-settled status and secure your right to live, work, study and receive benefits and services in the UK. You need to apply even if you:

- are a child
- have a (blue) Permanent Residence document
- have lived in the UK for many years or are married to a British national
- have children that are British
- are a non-EEA citizen and have an EEA Residence card/ Family Permit

COVID-19 Testing Over Half Term

As lockdown eases, taking a rapid COVID-19 test twice a week, even if you do not have symptoms, will help us stay ahead of the spread of the virus, particularly as new strains appear.

Around 1 in 3 people with COVID-19 have no symptoms and are spreading the virus without knowing. This includes those who have had their vaccine.

We want to thank you for your continued support in testing. Over 40 million tests of school staff and students have now been conducted as part of the education testing programme. Further Lateral Flow test kits will be distributed to students to ensure adequate supply over the half term break and into the remainder of the summer term.



Please remember to register your child's result using <u>TestRegister</u> and please, in addition, let the Academy know as soon as possible if your child receives a positive test result. Please also remember to register your child's kit and result on the NHS Test & Trace website.
