

Southfields Academy 6th Form Destinations Report 2020

Background

The destinations report is an investigation into the current destinations of Southfields students who were enrolled on Level 2 and 3 courses during the academic year 2019/20. The data can be used to help inform progression strategies, measure success and to identify where to target resources to improve post school outcomes.

Method

The investigation was undertaken during October/ November 2020 and thus provides a snapshot of activities at that time. Destinations were collated via UCAS application data, email, telephone follow up and evidence from tutorial contacts as well as parent and sibling information.

Analysis

The report relates to 195 students, broken down as follows: Level 2 (52 students) and Year 13 (143 students).

Recommendations:

Firstly there was no report for the last academic year, which means it is difficult to identify emerging trends or to compare progress made over the last two years.

This year across Year 12 and Year 13 there were massive gaps in student data (e.g, FSM, Ethnicity, SEN and HPA information). In addition to this, for students going to Further Education, nothing had been recorded in terms of courses/ areas of study. These gaps have led to a much less detailed report this year.

Overall - Main Findings

The percentage of leavers entering a positive destination is 94% across level 2 and 3 compared with the national figure of 88%. The proportion of Year 13 leavers entering higher education is 74%. 13% or 14 students went on to Russell Group universities.

The percentage of level 2 students who progress on to level 3 courses at Southfields is 54%. The percentage of leavers at level 3 entering employment or an apprenticeship is 12.5%. This again demonstrates how students are thinking carefully about their options and more students are considering alternatives to HE.

The number of leavers who are Unknown at the time of survey is 10. All other students in level 2 and 3 are involved in education, employment or training.

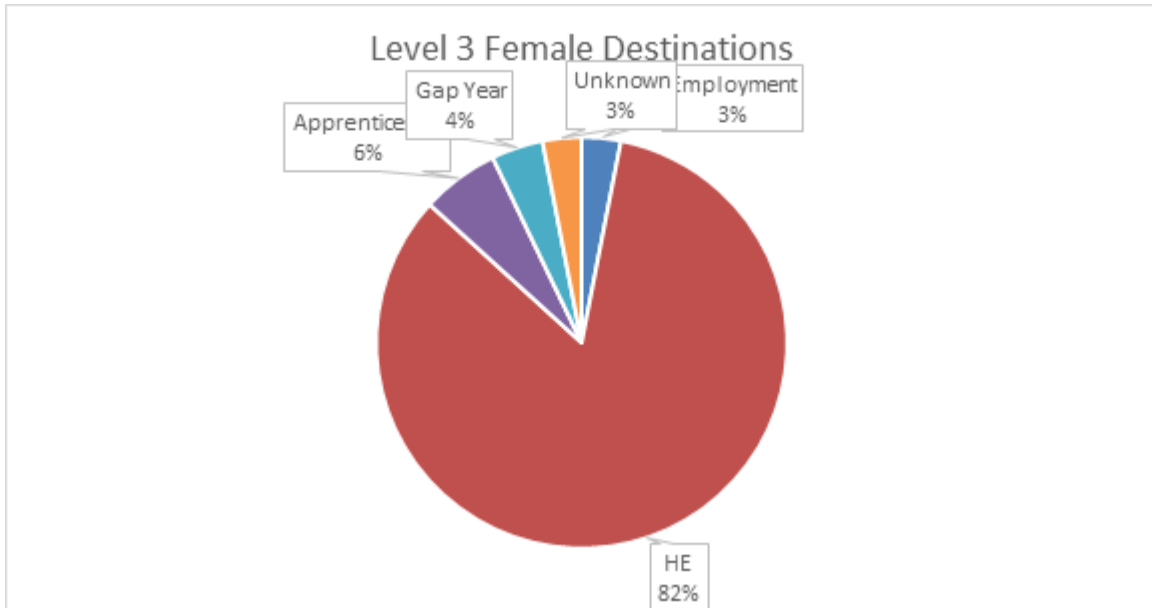
Level 3 Destinations as above [pie chart]

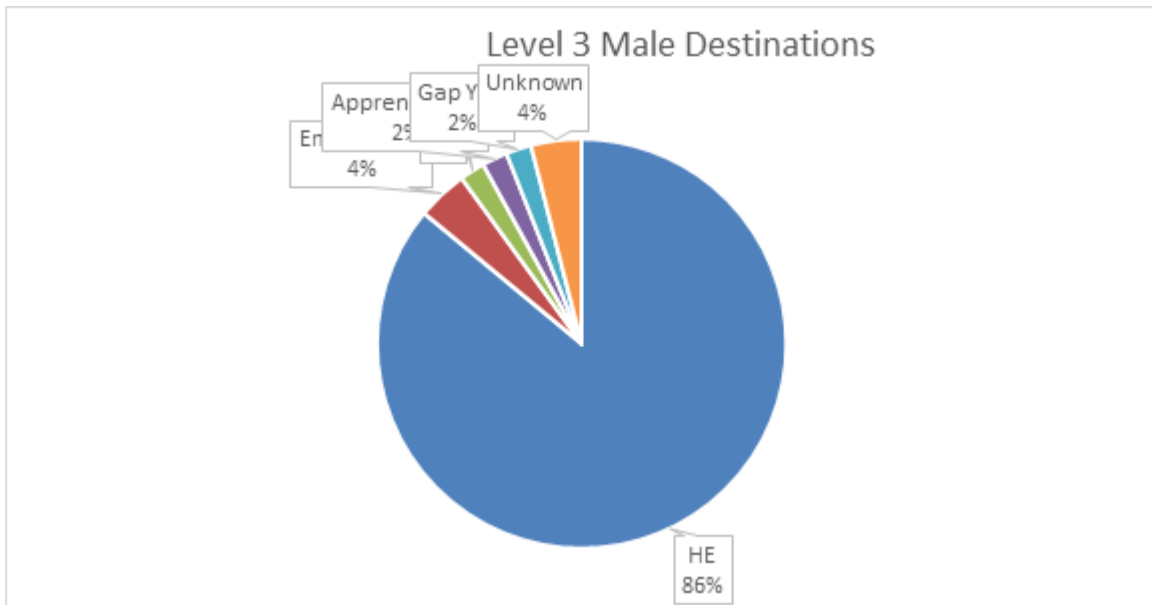

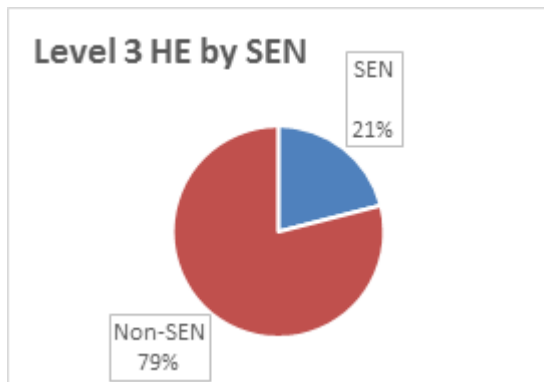
Level 3 Female Destinations



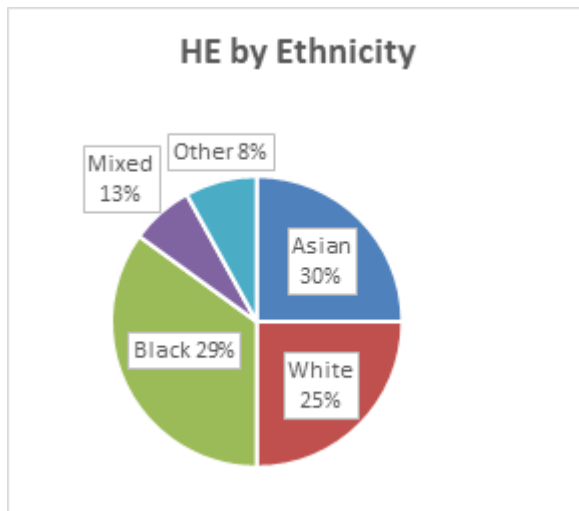
Level 3 Male Destinations

The vast majority of our Level 2 students stayed at Southfields and progress on to Level 3 or alternative Level 2 courses. Aside from the 5 unknowns, we know that only 8 Level 2 students opted to move on to new environments in other 6th forms and colleges. 29 of our students progressed to Level 3, while a further 8 remained at Level 2, but chose different courses. Unfortunately, we do not have our Level 2 leavers' course choice information as this wasn't gathered as part of the data this year.

Level 2

The Level 2 Leavers group was 60% male and 40% Female. Almost half (48%) had some form of special educational needs. 25% were entitled to Free School Meals.
