Tara Theatre Collaboration with Southfields Academy - Ms Risolino

Southfields and Tara Theatre in Earlsfield have a special relationship, where the academy and the theatre aim to provide work experience and opportunities through working with industry professionals in order to learn how to work as part of a theatre company. Last year students from Southfields were the opening act as Tara Theatre re-opened its doors after the pandemic theatre closures. It was a really proud moment and the students and theatre staff had a great time being creative once again, devising and performing a piece about their perspective of the post-pandemic world.

We are really keen to keep this going and this year there is another opportunity for girls and non-binary students of Southfields to have their voice heard again.

Outline of Activity

Working with Director Beth Kapila and a documentary Filmmaker, a group of young women will explore the daily experience of occupying public spaces. Through documenting their daily interactions in public spaces, from walking to school, getting the bus, playing sports and going to events, they will use this footage and first-hand accounts to work collaboratively to create a live performance. The process of creating the performance will be a safe space for young women to process their experiences and to come together to uncover what they want to see change in society so that they can thrive. The piece will be an opportunity for young women to agitate and be advocates for change in the causes, reporting and repercussions of street harassment.

There will be opportunities for young people to support the project in technical and other assistant roles. 2-hour weekly rehearsals 5-7pm on Tuesdays over 10 weeks (starting the 1st February 2022). 1 week intensive over Easter 2022 (w/c 4 April) culminating in 4 performances 8th-10th April All rehearsals and performances to happen at Tara Theatre in Earlsfield.

Biology residential Course - Mr Bhatti



A-Level Biology students recently attended a 3-day residential course at the Field Studies Council Juniper Hall, located in The Surrey Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). Students were not only able to immerse themselves into the world of conservation and ecology but they were also able to carry out their A-Level Required Practical outside of the classroom and laboratory, bringing a real-world relevance and context to their research and investigations.

It was a proud moment for the Biology department to see our Southfield students decide upon their own investigations, independently decide upon methods and choice of equipment and then autonomously collect data to statistically analyse for significance. In short, they carried out a mini version of an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) for the particular species they had identified.

The sixth form students were also able to experience what it feels like to stay in halls of residence and maturely put themselves to bed at a (relatively) reasonable hour after a long working day (8:30am - 7:00pm).

Other interesting activities on the trip included applying snail varnish to a species of snail and Mr Bhatti's questionable early-morning-wake-up-singing (OOOhhh what a beautiful morning, ooohhh what a beautiful day).
