Students shared feedback that they enjoyed the day and learnt what to do in certain emergencies.








Science Club - Mr Clarke


In this week's science club, students tested their reaction times in various ways.

Year 10 News - Ms Gavin

This term the Year 10s have taken on some great challenges; one of which is a drama club, which will be run by them. This has included creating a Power Point, which is going to be presented in assemblies to KS3 students and provides the Year 10 students with a chance to convey their GCSE drama knowledge and act as mentors for the younger students. We also hope to get some football-coaching going, mainly targeting KS3 girls.

Towards the end of the term, work experience will take place. Many students have already secured their placements. Some of the students are in nurseries, salons, schools, libraries and even public events! This is an opportunity for students to gain experience of working life outside of school and it will look amazing on their CVs. We still have a handful of students who have not secured a work experience placement and we urge them to try to find something as soon as possible. The earlier you look for a workplace the more choice you will have and doing a job you really want to do will make the placement much more enjoyable and worthwhile.

I would appreciate if you could relay to your child the importance of coming to school and being on time for lessons. Students are expected to arrive at school no later than 8.15am to ensure they get to their tutor bases for 8.20am when registration starts. If they are later than this, they will be marked as late.

We have the same expectation throughout the day when students are moving around the school from lesson to lesson. The students have 2 minutes to get to their next class and this should be enough time if they go straight from one lesson to the other.
