### Year 10 Maths Feast - Ms Goodden

On Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> February eight Year 10 students competed in the Year 10 Maths Feast at Raynes Park High School – Julia, Kavinran, Liam, Melody, Ray, Saad, Sophia and Yusra. They spent 2.5 hours competing against 26 other schools in mathematics challenges which were unlike their GCSE mathematics.

Round one was based on TV shows including Only Connect, Richard Osman's House of Games and The 1% Club (give the puzzles a go yourself!). In one question they had to estimate how many pet cats there were in the UK in 2021!

Round two was a challenging calculator cross-number.

Round three involved entering a Mathe**hat**ical Universe which is inhabited by the Maths-Hatters! Finally, round four saw our eight competitors building cubes and rhombic dodecahedra – not for the faint hearted.

Although our two teams didn't win, they finished in respectable mid-table positions. They showed excellent concentration, resilience and teamwork throughout the competition and were a credit to the school, their families and most importantly themselves. It was a pleasure taking them out for the afternoon.




## IG Go-Karting Day Out with KLS
