On Thursday 7th March 2024, Year 10s had the pleasure of welcoming Tiffany Caryn Kanco who is a Project Coordinator from Lixon.


Lixon is a new company built on 100 years of technology and expertise, and 60 years of substation and electrification project experience worldwide.


