

The Loudmouth programme uses well-researched drama and discussion workshops to help young people spot the signs of grooming, raise empathy for victims and see the impact of child exploitation. It highlights how perpetrators target young people's vulnerabilities, how victims and perpetrators can be anyone e.g. gender, ethnicity, age and the laws around coercive and controlling behaviour.

The students participated very well during the morning and we hope gained valuable insight into the subject matters covered.
